Pope Francis' Prayer to the Holy Family


Jesus, Mary and Joseph,

## **CULTURE OF LIFE - Roger Zurro**

Worthy Brothers, first of all, I am happy to report that the final total of unborn children saved as a result of the “40 Days for Life” Fall 2014 campaign is **546 nationwide!** And keep in mind that these lives saved aren’t just numbers; saving 546 individual human beings impacts their moms, their dads, grandparents, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, cousins. Each time a mother says “yes” to life, the effect is profound and far-reaching.

I sincerely hope and pray that more of you will feel the urgings of the Spirit to stand up for Life by joining me and participating in our local Spring 2015 “40 Days for Life” campaign which begins on Friday, February 20<sup>th</sup> through Friday, March 27<sup>th</sup>. For these six Fridays, we will be meeting on the sidewalk in front of the Planned Parenthood facility, 69 Newman Springs Road in Shrewsbury. Our objective is to peacefully demonstrate our support for the innocent unborn to those inside the facility, as well as to the passers-by, just by our presence and visibility. At the same time, we pray the rosary for all the victims of abortion – the child, the mother, the family, and those inside who facilitate and carry out the procedure. Thousands across the country, including our Brother Knights, will be doing the same in front of their local abortuaries. If you won’t consider participating in this noble effort in person, then support us spiritually by committing to say a Rosary each Friday during Lent that hearts may be changed and lives may be saved.

Be mindful that the tide is turning in support of life.

There are many polls taken annually on the question of pro-life vs. pro-choice with varying results. The overall trend over time since the Roe vs. Wade ruling by the Supreme Court in 1973 is that young people are

rejecting abortion-on-demand in increasing numbers. It is up to us as Knights to defend these unborn innocents as long as it takes, until victory can be achieved and these babies can enjoy the protection of our Constitution which guarantees LIFE, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness to all.

On another note, the U.S. bishops set aside this past October 2014 as Respect Life Month, kicking off the year-long Respect Life Program. The bishops call upon Catholics and all people of goodwill across the nation during 2015 to reflect on the sanctity of all human life and to work toward its protection. This year’s theme is “Each of us is a masterpiece of God’s creation,” adapted from Pope Francis’ writings. Imagine yourself pausing in front of a design of great beauty; your soul quiets and is filled with wonder and awe. If art, created by man, can evoke such a response within us, then how much greater should our wonder, reverence and respect be for each person, handcrafted by the very God who spoke the world into being? God created each of us with precision and purpose, and He looks on each of us with love that cannot be outdone in intensity or tenderness. No matter how the world might view us or others, let us treat each person as the masterpiece that he or she is.

Each of us was created as unique - with specific gifts, talents, and abilities to love others. ## HISTORY NOTES - Spencer Purdum

How a guy with degrees in Civil Engineering became a historian is beyond me. I'll say this, though: The critics in my new career are much kinder.

I've been thinking on the parallels between the Parish's 150 years of existence and our 101 years. At its founding, St. Rose covered an area of about 125 square miles. In 1913, Freehold Council covered almost as much territory, reaching into Colts Neck, Marlboro, Manalapan, Millstone and Howell-even as far as Hightstown. And, as the population justified new parishes, so were new Councils formed in Englishtown, Lincroft, Farmingdale, Hightstown and (just weeks ago) Marlboro.

We, at Freehold Council, have been happy to have had good relations with our home Parish, St. Rose of Lima, for a hundred years. While our founding pastor, Msgr. Kivelitz, was not himself a Knight, he permitted us to form and perform our fraternal

activities. At least a third of the sixty-odd priests who have served here have been members of this Council-and many others have been members elsewhere.

Our Knights were front and center in the parish's sesquicentennial celebration. Our PGK Rick Scott served as MC for the dinner (as well as singing at the Mass;) PGK and FDD Stan and Lady Julie Buraczynski chaired the dinner reservations; the photomontage shown at the dinner, and the History DVD now available were produced by brother Bob Bonardi; and, as a body, we took up four tables at the dinner. The Fourth Degree Color Corps, composed of members of four Western Monmouth councils, escorted Bishop O'Connell into Mass. This was, by the way, Pat McCobb's final detail as Color Corps Commander; best of wishes to him.

## **AFTER THOUGHTS - Mike La Rosa**

As you may have noticed, this edition of the Compass covers only a two month span instead of the typical three month period. The following edition will start the K of C year (*which starts on July 1<sup>st</sup>*) off with the new council officers. This is a good change that will keep you more in tune with your Brother Knights and with the Gregorian calendar which everyone knows starts on January 1<sup>st</sup> and was initiated by Pope Gregory the XIII in 1582. While surfing the net searching for "Why we fast & abstain from meat during Lent" I found an interesting article at Catholic Online by Father Lawrence DiNardo of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. Here's an excerpt of the article.

In today's super-sized, secular culture of consumption, the precept for fasting and abstinence may seem out of place. But, according to Father DiNardo, fasting and abstinence have a long history

reaching back to ancient Israel and even non-Christian traditions. In a way, the question isn't why Catholics happen to fast and abstain, but why others don't. Fasting and abstinence gives Catholics an opportunity to slow down and draw nourishment from a different source. As acts of penance, fasting and abstinence help us acknowledge the sin in our lives. "When we fast and abstain we take attention away from ourselves," Father DiNardo said. "It isn't meant for weight loss. The tradition is based in the idea of denying oneself to focus on something greater." Before the Second Vatican Council, the regulations were much more stringent than they are today. As older Catholics will remember, every Friday of the year was a day of abstinence for all, and every day during Lent was a day of fasting. "In easing the regulations, the church wasn't trying to make the precept more convenient, but was placing the responsibility of spirituality on individual Catholics," Father DiNardo said. Every day of our lives should be a day of focusing more on God and other people and less on ourselves. Sticking to the minimum when it comes to fast and abstinence misses an opportunity for spiritual growth. So where does this leave the parish fish fry? Fish fries are fine.
