CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE - Rev. Edward M. Jawidzik



Known for his holiness and learning, his writing and his preaching, Bishop John Neumann (1811 – 1860) is the first American bishop to be canonized a saint. Blessed Pope Paul VI, on October 19, 1977 recognized his life of service, zeal and compassion for the guidance of God's people in the New World.

John Nepomucene Neumann

came to our nation from Bohemia, today the Czech Republic, and after his ordination to the holy priesthood, he devoted himself to parish work. Parishes at that time were vast areas. John's parish was near Buffalo, New York where he ministered to 400 widely scattered families of various ethnic backgrounds. For that reason, his language skills were much appreciated. His special love, however, was the catechetical instruction of children.

Seeking to enrich his own spiritual life, he entered the Redemptorists and became the first member of that congregation to profess vows in the United States in 1842. Ten years later he was made Bishop of Philadelphia.

When John arrived in Philadelphia as bishop in 1852, there were two Catholic grammar schools in that diocese. At the time of his death, eight years later, there were 0ne hundred.

To Cardinal Barnaby he wrote, "I am much accustomed to the country, and will be able to care for the people and faithful living in the mountains, in the coal mines and on the farms, since I would be among them. I have taken this burden out of obedience, and I have labored with all my powers to fulfill the duties of my office."

To Saint John Neumann goes the credit for initiating the Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion in the United State. Notable, too, was his charity towards the poor & needy, so much so that he was at times chided for his frugality with respect to his own belongings.

On January 5th every year, we honor our first American bishop and saint. We can express our thanks to God for the many pioneer priests and bishops in our nation's history. They labored with a holy zeal to build up the community of God's people in our land, the community from which we draw our strength & encouragement in our time.

March for Life Statement on Planned Parenthood's Election Reaction

Jeanne Mancini, President of March for Life Education and Defense Fund

"Abortion proponents are working passionately to assure that taxpayers will continue to pay for abortion via the nation's largest abortion provider, Planned Parenthood. They are clearly not understanding or listening to the American people who have a consensus on life issues (see Marist Poll Results below). Planned Parenthood annually performs over 320,000 abortions a year subsidized by taxpayers. The non-profit spent \$30 million to help abortion advocates run for office. They did not win one race. The American people rejected the radical, abortion until birth position, as they have consistently done. Eight out of ten Americans agree that abortion should be limited to - at most - the first three months of pregnancy. The American people also overwhelmingly reject taxpayer funding of abortion."

Marist Poll Results - A new survey by the Knights of Columbus-Marist Poll shows that a strong majority of Americans support conscience protection for medical professionals.

As Congress considers the Conscience Protection Act, by nearly 20 points (56 percent to 37 percent), Americans say that medical professionals & organizations should be able to opt out of abortion procedures & coverage. Among registered voters, the results are 57 percent to 36 percent.

"Consistent with our First Amendment guarantees, the American people believe that no person or organization should be compelled to help perform or cover abortion," said Knights of Columbus CEO Carl Anderson. "It is important that our elected officials continue to protect these important rights, and no American ever be forced to be involved in abortion against their conscience or religious beliefs."

The survey of 1,009 adults was conducted July 5-12, 2016, by the Marist Institute for Public Opinion & sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. Adults 18 years of age and older residing in the continental United States were interviewed on either landline or mobile phones in English using live interviewers. Results for adults are statistically significant within ±3.1 percentage points. The error margin increases for cross-tabulations.

FIELD AGENT'S REPORT - Bruce Sarte

Have you ever stopped to think of the primary reason for the existence of the Knights of Columbus? Do you remember the hardship that our ancestors, as Catholic Immigrants to the United States, faced before the inception of the Knights of Columbus? Did you know that Rev. Michael J. McGivney, our Venerable Founding Father, experienced firsthand the financial ruins of losing his father prematurely? Father McGivney wanted to give Catholic families the opportunity to remain together, even when the breadwinner was no longer able to provide the financial support due to his death. In his Biography, "The Parish Priest" we learn that "the primary motivation" for founding the Knights of Columbus "was the promulgation of insurance for Catholics in the working classes." Father McGivney is asking us to continue to grow the Order with this primary mission at the forefront of our works.

You may recall, the first principal of the Order is **Charity.** Your council puts forth a great effort in raising charitable dollars, and I commend you all for doing so. Over the last 10 years, the Knights, as a whole, have contributed close to \$2 Billion Dollars towards its Charitable Endeavors. One of the more recent examples of how your dollars have impacted more than just your household is the immediate response to Hurricane Matthew. At this time it is

too soon to have a dollar amount of what will be contributed towards this disaster by the Order, but you can trust that a large portion of the monetary assistance will come directly from the Knights of Columbus' Insurance Program. You may also recall our response to the Earthquake in Haiti, and our commitment to provide prosthetics to the men, women, and children who lost their limbs during this great disaster. We want you to know that when you participate in the Order's Insurance Program, you are not only protecting your family, but are also helping the Knights do what we do best, be Charitable! Currently the Freehold Council membership demonstrates a 25% participation in what is the most valuable benefit to our members, the Insurance Program. I would encourage all participating and non-participating members to take some time to meet with me and discuss your financial picture.
