

CULTURE OF LIFE - Roger Zurro

"Human life is sacred and inviolable at every moment of existence, including the initial phase which precedes birth. All human beings, from their mother's womb, belong to God who searches them and knows them, who forms them and knits them together with his own hands, who gazes on them when they are tiny shapeless embryos and already sees in them the adults of tomorrow whose days are numbered and whose vocation is even now written in the 'book of life.' There too, when they are still in their mothers' womb-as many passages of the Bible bear witness-they are the personal objects of God's loving & fatherly providence." (Evangelium Vitae, 61)

In his 1995 Encyclical, Evangelium Vitae, St. John Paul Il called on all Catholic faithful to bear witness to the Gospel of Life and to build the "civilization of life and love" (100). In keeping with this mission and our Order's Catholic principles of charity, unity, and fraternity, the Knights of Columbus stands strong in its conviction that every human life is a gift of God, endowed with certain inalienable rights — the first among these being the right to life. Even in the midst of difficulties and uncertainties, we believe that human life is sacred and inviolable, and ought to be defended with maximum determination. To this end, the Knights of Columbus supports policies that promote a Culture of Life and opposes legislative efforts that promote abortion, contraception, sterilization, cloning, the destruction of embryos, assisted suicide, euthanasia, unjust war, and the death penalty when there is an

acceptable alternative.

One of the most effective ways in which the Knights of Columbus has promoted a Culture of Life and helped thousands of women save their children is through the Ultrasound Initiative. The program has funded and placed about 900 ultrasound machines – valued at approximately \$44 million – in all 50 states and Canada.

Our Order's steadfast defense and promotion of a Culture of Life is grounded on our ultimate assurance that in the natural law written in the heart of every person is the recognition that human life is sacred from its very beginning to its end. In the depths of our consciousness, human intellect knows that the very source of its existence—i.e. human life—ought to be protected and celebrated. In that regard, the message of the Knights of Columbus extends far beyond our Order and our religious creed; it is a universal message that every person of good will can come to affirm.

The right to life is unlike any other right. It is the most basic right and the condition of all other personal rights, constituting the foundation of every human community and the political community itself. St. John Paul II famously noted that if human life itself is not respected, then respect for all other rights—for example, the right to health, to marriage, to culture, to religion—is "false and illusory." Human rights of every kind are "incomprehensible" without the right to life. Our Order, therefore, joins the universal Church in acknowledging the dignity of human life and in its efforts to achieve legal and constitutional protection for every human person at the international, national, state, and local levels.

ADVOCATES MESSAGE - Joseph Virgilio

Protocol, is basic common courtesy.

Proper protocol should be followed by all fraternal members The Knights of Columbus Protocol Handbook (#1612) and "The Method of Conducting Council Meetings" (#10318) contains specific information governing many types of situations where protocol is involved.

By definition, Protocol is a system of rules that explain the correct conduct and procedures to be followed. Protocol means the rules of diplomatic etiquette.

Protocol is the code setting forth the degree of obedience, the order of proceedings and the rules of official and social behavior.

Councils must conduct their meetings in accordance with the Charter, Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus, supplemented by the by-laws and according to parliamentary procedure.

Some simple illustrations of council protocol: When a member wishes to speak, he does so by rising from his seat, addressing the chair by saying "Worthy Grand Knight" and renders the salute (Representing the tree of the Cross), the member makes a vertical motion, with his arm and vertically opened hand, from top to bottom.

The presiding officer (i.e. The Grand Knight or his delegate) should at all times refer to and address the Officers by their proper titles.

All members who are not officers should be

recognized by name as "Brother".

All questions or comments must be directed to the chair (the Grand Knight or presiding officer), for example: "Worthy Grand Knight may ask the previous speaker to explain..." side discussions should not take place.

All council or assembly officers should wear some form of identifying tag or name plate.

All council officers should wear their current jewel of office at all meetings and official functions of the Order.

Robert's Rules of Order is the standard for facilitating discussions and group decision-making for councils.

Basic elements of Robert's Rules are :

Motion: To introduce a new piece of business or propose a decision or action, a motion must be made by a member ("I move that.....") A second must then also be made (i.e. "I second it.") After limited optional discussion, a vote on the motion can be made. A majority vote is required for the motion to pass.

Postpone: When passed, the motion cannot be reintroduced at the same meeting. This is made as a motion (*"I move to postpone indefinitely…"*). A second is required. A majority vote is required to postpone the motion under consideration.

However, it may be brought up again at a later date.

Amend: Used to change a motion under consideration. ("I move to amend the motion on the floor.") This also requires a second. After the motion to amend is seconded, a majority vote is needed to decide whether the amendment is accepted. Then a vote is taken on the amended motion.

able: Is to lay aside the business at hand, ("I make a motion to table this discussion until the next meeting...") A second is needed and a majority vote required to table the item being discussed.

This article is far from all-inclusive on the subject of Knights of Columbus protocol and Robert's Rules of Order and is guide to just some of the parliamentary procedures followed at council

(Continued from previous Compass)

- * August 14, 1890, a Thursday, Father McGivney died, his funeral Mass was celebrated in Thomaston, Conn. not New Haven Conn.
- * 1895: The Vatican's first acknowledgment of the Knights of Columbus comes when Archbishop Francesco Satolli, apostolic delegate to the United States, writes a letter extolling the "merits of this splendid Catholic organization" and giving the Order his apostolic blessing.
- * 1896 The need for a patriotic degree was first considered.
- * 1899 a special plea was made at the National Meeting for a patriotic degree.
- I 900 The first Fourth Degree exemplification with I,100 Knights participating at the Lenox Lyceum in New York City
- * 1951 The Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus adopted a resolution to amend the Pledge of Allegiance as recited in their own meetings with the addition of the words "**Under God**" after the words "**One Nation.**"

* 1953 seventeen resolutions were introduced to

the House of Representatives to add **"Under God"** to the Pledge

June 14, 1954 resolution(s) adopted, and passed and signed into law by President Eisenhower on Flag Day.
