SPIRITUAL ADVISOR - Deacon, Andrew Luhman

We Americans have recently observed the 18th Anniversary of the 9-11 destruction of the Twin Towers in NYC and the loss of over 3,000 lives that day. The initial reaction to this evil act for many was anger and the intense desire to seek revenge against those who were responsible. Our Lord has commanded us to love all our sisters and brothers without exception. What He did not command us to do was to like everyone. God has reserved for Himself that He would seek revenge against wrong doers.

The following 3 essays speak to the topic of love.

THE POWER OF LOVE

This what God commands... that we love each other. (I John3:23). Does bumping into people leave you brittle, breakable and fruitless? Do you easily fall apart? If so you may be grounded in the wrong soil. It may be rooted in their love (which is fickle) or in your resolve to love (which is frail). John urges us to "rely on the love God has for us." He alone is the power source.

Many people tell us to love. Only God gives us the power to do so. We know what God wants us to do. "This is what God commands...that we love each other" (I John 3:23). But how can we? How can we be kind to the vow breakers? To those who are unkind to us? How can we be patient with people who have the warmth of a vulture and the tenderness of a porcupine? How can we forgive the moneygrubbers and the backstabbers we meet, love and marry? How can we love as God loves? We want to. We long to. But how can we? By living love.

LOVE IS PATIENT

Let your patience show itself perfectly in what you do. (James 1:4) Some time ago our church staff attended a leadership conference. Especially interested in one

class, I arrived early and snagged a front row seat. As the speaker began, however, I was distracted by a couple of voices in the back of the room. Two guys were mumbling to each other. I was giving serious thought to shooting a glare over my shoulder when the speaker offered an explanation. "Forgive me", he said. "I forgot to explain why the 2 fellows at the back of the class are talking. One of them is an elder at a new church in Romania. He has traveled here to learn about church leadership. But he doesn't speak English, so the message is being translated." All of a sudden everything changed. Patience replaced impatience. Why? Because patience always hitches a ride with understanding. "A man with understanding holds his tongue" (Prov. 11:12 NIV). Don't miss the connection between understanding and patience. Before you blow up, listen up. Before you strike out, listen in.

UNFAILING LOVE

"I will forgive them for leaving me and I will love them freely." (Hosea 14:4) Are you convinced you have never lived a loveless day? Not one. Never loved? Those times you deserted Christ? He loved you. You hid from Him; He came looking for you. And those occasions you denied Christ? Though you belong to Him, you hung with them, and when His name surfaced, you cursed like a drunken sailor. God let you hear the crowing of conscience and feel the heat of tears. But He never let you go. Your denials cannot diminish His love. Nor can your doubts. You've had them. You may have them even now. While there is much we cannot know, may never know, can't we be sure of this? Doubts don't separate doubters from God's love.

To be loved is divine, to love someone unconditionally is a blessing for you both!

Euthanasia Doctor On Trial for Restraining and Killing Resisting Woman in Holland

A Dutch doctor has appeared in court after she euthanized a 74 year-old woman with severe dementia.

Prosecutors have described how the doctor did not gain full consent from the woman before she was killed in 2016. Allegedly, the doctor secretly slipped a sedative into the woman's coffee. They said that family members were ordered to hold down their struggling relative while she was administered with a lethal injection. Prosecutors say that not enough was done to verify her consent to be euthanized.

The Laws: This is not the first time that the Netherlands has faced the spotlight regarding its lax suicide laws. In July, SPUC reported that doctors in the Netherlands were facing immense pressure to euthanize patients, which included pressure from emotional blackmail, coercion from the relatives of patients and organizational pressure. Since the Netherlands legalized euthanasia in 2002, approximately 5000 Dutch citizens are being killed by medically-assisted methods every year.

The Details: Four years before the woman's death, she was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease. In a statement, the patient wrote how she wished to be euthanized before entering a care home. However, the patient also added that she wanted to be able to decide when to die. Before entering into care, the

suicide doctor determined that the patient should be killed. The doctor then slipped a sedative into the woman's drink which caused her to lose consciousness. However, the woman awoke shortly after, to find her daughter and husband holding her down. She is reported to have struggled against them, as the doctor then proceeded to kill her by lethal injection. The daughter of the deceased woman thanked the suicide doctor for her actions.

The Consequences: Despite the unsettling details of the case, prosecutors are not seeking a prison sentence for the doctor. At the center of the case is the question of consent in relation to the Netherlands' euthanasia laws. A spokesperson for the prosecution has said that they do not doubt the doctor's honest intentions. The Director of SPUC's Patients First Network, Antonia Tully, described the doctor's actions as an "act which exploits the vulnerability of patients. The suicide doctor in question secretly sedated a patient, while her family restrained her as she struggled. Actions such as these are that of utter depravity which must be condemned. Nations which exercise the deadly practice of euthanasia, inevitably introduce the exploitation and abuse of vulnerable patients"

Ms Tully said that scenes seeping out of the Netherlands highlight the true and vicious nature of medically assisted death, and emphasized that patients are entitled to care, respect and basic human dignity.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT - George Ferriso

Since this is the last issue of the Compass for the calendar year 2019, I want to wish you and your families a Merry Merry Christmas and a Healthy and Happy New Year. In addition I will again discuss the New Year's (2020) **Dues Invoices** and **Dues** process.

Please read the below carefully. After over 6 years of doing this, I STILL get notified by our membership that they did not receive any notification of dues. The procedure has NOT changed.

DUES INVOICES: If we have an email address on file for you, please check your email the first or second week of December. (If you have changed your email since last year and have not notified me, please do so ASAP.) You will receive an Electronic Invoice with the Subject line "Dues Notice for Council 1672". If we have no email address on file please check your mail box around the same time, you will receive a paper invoice via the Post Office. Please pay your dues by January 31, 2020 to avoid a second invoice going out. Like last year, anyone paying after 1/31/20 will be assessed a \$5.00 Administration fee to cover the extra cost of time, paper, ink, envelopes and postage. The dues can be mailed to my home 361 Colgate Way, Freehold, NJ 07728, given to me personally or dropped in the Council Mailbox addressed, Attn: George F. You can also pay multiple years if you choose. Those members that have prepaid in 2019 along with all Honorary Life members will receive their member cards in the beginning of December.

Dues: Member Dues are the only monies the council receives that are used for the operation of the council.

The Per Capita we pay both State and Supreme is quite substantial. Unfortunately, for the last 5 years we have been averaging a deficit to run the council. We have an emergency fund which was put into place many years ago which covers the deficit for a while and then gets reimbursed each year as dues come in. This emergency fund is also being depleted, but I am going to hold the dues for another year at \$40.00 even though a dues increase was approved on Sept 11, 2018. Dues have not been raised in 10 years and I would challenge anyone to let me know what has NOT gone up in 10 years. Honorary Life members are still exempt from paying (although we have quite a few HL members that give us a donation!). In addition Honorary members will still pay \$10.80 in dues. This amount is set by Supreme and I have not received any information about that changing at this writing.
