Sanity, and Pushback from the People; Ohio Bill Proposal Bans Teaching of Critical Race Theory

Ohio is the latest state in which lawmakers have introduced legislation to ban the teaching of far-left critical race theory (CRT) in public schools, this time with the added step of protecting a teacher's right to refuse to promote gender-fluid ideology.

HB 322 forbids school officials from requiring that educators "discuss current events or widely debated and currently controversial issues of public policy or social affairs" (and requires that teachers who choose to do so "strive to explore such issues from diverse and contending perspectives"); requiring students to engage in political lobbying or protesting for class credit; or teaching that any race or sex is inherently superior, shameful, or oppressive, that members of different races shouldn't engage each other in a color -blind manner, that present members of one race bear responsibility for the past crimes of others, that hard work is a concept inherently belonging to or at odds with any one races, or that slavery was not merely a grievous sin of past Americans, but was fundamentally intertwined with the United States' founding principles.

It also bars school districts from accepting private funds for the purpose of "curriculum development, purchase or selection of curricular materials, teacher training, professional development, or continuing teacher education" on history, civics, or politicsrelated subjects; and ensures that teachers cannot be forced to "affirm a belief in the systemic nature of racism, or like ideas, or in the multiplicity or fluidity of gender identities, or like ideas, against the teacher's sincerely held religious or philosophical convictions."

"The government is giving that to teachers as a kind of 'save yourself' from getting fired for not

believing in transgender rights," LGBT activist Daniel Tirabassi <u>complained</u> to CBS affiliate WKBN. But one of the bill's authors, Republican State Rep. Don Jones, responded that "HB 322 is an anti-discrimination bill that promotes equality. Anything to the contrary is wrong. The bill also reinforces teachers' basic rights that they not be compelled by the government to adopt any belief systems and indoctrinate their students with those teachings."

The bulk of the new language is meant to quash the taxpayer-subsidized propagation of critical race theory, a <u>doctrine that asserts</u> race is a "socially constructed (culturally invented) category that is used to oppress and exploit people of color," and that "law and legal institutions in the United States are inherently racist insofar as they function to create and maintain social, economic, and political inequalities between whites and nonwhites, especially African Americans."

Critical race theory's spread in public schools has been a topic of growing concern on the Right. Conservatives argue that it stokes racial divisions rather than healing them; former President Donald Trump worked to remove it from federal training programs and publicly advocated its removal from public education. One of President Joe Biden's first acts was to dismantle Trump's 1776 Commission, an antidote to the race-minded, error-riddled 1619 Project that called for educational curricula focused on teaching students to understand and embrace the founding principles of the United States.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT - George Ferriso

The Columbian year 2020 - 2021 dues collection has finally come to an end. At the time of this writing, we still have 19 Brothers that have not paid their dues for the year. The suspensions have gone into Supreme and they will be taken out of the email system in July when the Suspensions are processed. These men know who they are and can still pay their dues and be returned to a good standing.

Here are the "stats" for our council. We completed this year's billing cycle at 94% of membership paid. Current membership numbers stand at 390 + 39 Inactive members for a total of 429. (Inactive members are members that have been suspended or removed from the council, but need to stay on the Roster due to them having KofC insurance) Of these 429, 14 are Honorary members, (at least 65 years old and 25 <u>continuous years</u> of service) 87 are Honorary Life members, (at least 70 years old and 25 <u>continuous years</u> of service) and 85 are 4th degree members. Remember too, that if you are a 4th degree member and are suspended from the council you are also suspended from the 4th degree

regardless if your dues are paid in the 4th degree. In addition, we have 10 Brothers that are nonagenarian's (men that are 90 - 99 years of age.) and one man is 101! May God bless them!!

We are STILL missing or have incorrect phone numbers from a lot of members. I still get NO replies from any request that I send out. Is it so hard to write a couple of phone numbers and an email address and shove it in the mailbox? I asked before for someone, anyone, to please let me know what the problem is! Big things are happening in the near future. I am not referring to the lifting of Covid restrictions and the opening up of our churches, or our KofC Council 1672's election of our officers for the year 2021/22, as important as they all are. No, I'm referring to the meeting of the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and a U. S. Supreme Court (SCOTUS) hearing.

At their virtual meeting on June 16th – 18th, the USCCB was scheduled to discuss the controversial topic of Catholic public officials receiving the Holy Eucharist while defending the deadly abortion laws. How any person can say that killing an unborn baby is ok boggles my mind. (Roman Catholics can not support abortion in any way) Maybe by the time you read this we will all know what the Bishops have decided. If no resolution has been announced, pray that the present-day Apostles made the correct decision.

The results are in. The outcome of the June electronic convention is that the Bishops will draw up a Holy Eucharist document and vote on it at an in-person general assembly in November. Between now and then they plan some regional meetings to discuss the document's wording. So we should know by the Winter Compass what they have decided. Hopefully.

The next big happening is that SCOTUS has decided to hear the Mississippi case of, Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health Organization. Mississippi has recently passed a law that prohibits aborting an unborn baby after 15 weeks. No date has been set for the hearing at this time. Some have predicted that this is going to change the federal abortion laws that we now have. Each state will then have to make their own law. Let's everyone pray if not an end to all abortions, at least restricting the ones that we have, so not as many precious lives are lost.

There is nothing that is so cherished as living. Ask anyone who has a terminal illness and they will tell you. Even a fifteen week unborn infant feels pain, so it is definitely alive.
