The Spectre of Socialized Medicine Looms,
How Would You Feel if
You Were These Parents?

In England, an ill baby girl's parents will this week beg a High Court judge to grant her a chance to stay alive. Indi Gregory faces having life-saving treatment denied after doctors said it would be kinder to let her die. The six-month-old girl is battling mitochondrial disease. Little Indi's parents say that despite her disability, she is a happy baby who responds to their touch. Her father Dean Gregory told the London Daily Mail: "Indi is a strong little girl and a real fighter. She deserves a chance at life. The hospital wants to take this away and we are beyond horrified." Doctors are understood to have concluded that Indi suffers from so many profoundly serious conditions that invasive treatments would not be in her best interests.

Mr Gregory, 37, said: "She could have surgery to fix her heart, but we don't think the doctors think it is worth it because of her other conditions." The parents have spent the past six months at their daughter's bedside at the Queen's Medical Center in Nottingham, along with the three other daughters they have between them.

Indi's father said: "Look, if we thought Indi was brain-dead, we would be utterly crushed but we wouldn't be disagreeing with the doctors. But our daughter responds to us, and on her good days she is babbling, making noises, moving all her limbs. Her parents say that despite her

disability, she is a happy baby who responds to their touch. They understand that Indi will never be the same as other children because she has several disabilities but urged doctors to give her a "chance at life. "She can definitely experience happiness. She cries like a normal baby. We don't know how well she can see yet, but she follows the action if watching an iPad and she looks at us when we speak. We know she is disabled, but you don't just let disabled people die. We just want to give her a chance."

Mr. Gregory added: "She has had infections and seizures, but she is being discriminated against because she has mitochondrial disease. If a healthy child got an infection, they would be treated accordingly, but if Indi gets an infection, the doctors don't seem to want to give her a fighting chance to get better". They are saying she should get palliative care only. She is disabled but that does not mean she does not have a good quality of life."

Doctors are understood to have concluded that Indi suffers from so many profoundly serious conditions that invasive treatments would not be in her best interests. After the hospital and the parents failed to agree, the hospital decided to ask the High Court to make a ruling. A judge will be asked on Friday to authorize doctors to stand back from carrying out life-saving treatment if Indi needs it to stay alive.

Michelle Rhodes, the Chief Nurse at Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust, said: "Cases like this are so difficult and we are of course saddened that we are unable to do more for Indi, but we will always act in the best interests of our patients and do all we can to advocate for them when needed. We can confirm that the Trust has made an application to the High Court to ensure that Indi's best interests can be protected."

(Excerpted from The London Daily Mail, 2023) (Editor's Comment: This story of a little life and parent's rights over their children lends to the argument that medical decisions by medical professionals will be guided in the future by the financial dictates of health insurance providers, public and private. The primacy of morals, medical ethics, and the Hippocratic Oath are being displaced in favor of economic considerations.)

For those of you that are skeptical about Venmo, for the 2023 dues collection period, 83 members used Venmo or about 28%. I have also received many donations, payment for the Pride in Priest Dinner, and Christmas blankets/wreaths via the Venmo Account. If you need directions on how to use Venmo, please contact me.

For some reason which Venmo has no answer for, when you start to type this email, a message will pop up saying they "couldn't find any matches".. continue to type the entire address. Once the entire

address is typed, on the top, you will see Pay or Request "kofc1672FS@gmail.com" Tap this message, put the \$60.00 amount in and tap Pay. It will come to me.

After over 9 years of doing this I STILL get notified by our membership that they did not receive any notification of dues. The procedure has NOT changed in 9 years! Your dues notice was sent out either electronic or via Snail Mail.

If you are having any kind of difficulties, money, health or whatever else please notify us, we can make arrangements. If we have an email address on file for you, please check your email the first or second week of December. (If you have changed your email since last year and have not notified me, please do so ASAP). You will receive an Electronic Invoice with the Subject line "Dues Notice for Council 1672". PLEASE CHECK YOUR SPAM FOLDER! If we have no email address on file please check your mail box around the same time, you will receive a paper invoice via the Post Office.

As always we are STILL missing or have incorrect phone numbers from a lot of members. I find out about changes of address by accident when the mail comes back.
