#### **Supreme Court Delivers Unanimous Victory for Religious**

#### **Freedom**

When government bureaucrats start playing theologian, deciding which religious activities are "religious enough" to deserve constitutional protection, you know we've got an administrative state with tentacles that reach far beyond its intended purpose. That's exactly what happened in Wisconsin, where state officials took it upon themselves to judge whether a Catholic charity's work was sufficiently spiritual to qualify for religious tax exemptions. Wisconsin authorities declared that Catholic Charities charitable work was "primarily secular" because they served people of all faiths and employed non-Catholics. The state's message was crystal clear: conform to our narrow definition of religious behavior, or pay up. This wasn't just about unemployment taxes – it was about who gets to define what constitutes religious activity in America. But on June 5th the U.S. Supreme Court delivered a resounding rebuke to Wisconsin's overreach. In a unanimous decision that should send shockwaves through every state capitol where bureaucrats think they can second-guess religious institutions, the justices reversed Wisconsin's ruling entirely.

From the Supreme Court opinion:

When the government distinguishes among religions based on theological differences in their provision of services, it imposes a denominational preference that must satisfy the highest level of judicial scrutiny. Because Wisconsin has transgressed that principle without the tailoring necessary to survive such scrutiny, the judgment of the Wisconsin Supreme Court is reversed. Justice Sonia Sotomayor, writing for the entire Court, didn't mince words about Wisconsin's constitutional violation. The state had engaged in "unnecessary entanglement" by attempting to define religious behavior according to bureaucratic criteria rather than respecting the First Amendment's clear protections. The state had argued that Catholic Charities didn't engage in "distinctively religious activities" and hadn't asserted "religious objections" to unemployment insurance. But here's the thing they conveniently ignore – faith organizations shouldn't have to prove their religious good faith to government officials who wouldn't know authentic ministry even if it served them soup in a church basement.

This unanimous decision represents far more than one charity's tax bill. It's the latest evidence that President Trump's judicial appointments are delivering exactly the constitutional restoration that conservative voters hoped for when they elected him. The Supreme Court that Trump reshaped is systematically dismantling decades of hostility toward religious institutions. The economic implications alone are staggering. This decision could clear the way for states nationwide to broaden religious tax exemptions, potentially saving faith-based charities millions of dollars that can be redirected toward their actual mission of serving communities For too long, secular bureaucrats have treated religious organizations like unwelcome guestsat America's constitutional table. They've demanded that faith-based institutions check their beliefs at the door if they want equal treatment under the law. Thursday's unanimous decision signals that era is ending.

And that, Brothers, is a victory not just for Catholic Charities, but for every American who believes our founders knew what they were doing when they put religious freedom first in the Bill of Rights. The Supreme Court has sent an unmistakable message: government officials don't get to play theology professor when determining which religious activities deserve constitutional protection.

# FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT - George Ferriso

Summer is finally here, barbeques, Hamburgers, Franks and Only one Knights of Columbus meeting during July and August!. The end of the 2024-2025 Columbian year is now over. The weather is warming up, and the days are longer! Congratulations to the new council officers for 2025-2026 and welcome back the familiar faces of the previous leadership. As the Financial Secretary of this council, am responsible for the revenue we get from various fundraisers and our our membership information. Boring stuff, but many of you, especially you newer men, may be interested in these numbers.

The Columbian year 2024 – 2025 dues collection has finally ended. This year, we had five men that chose not to continue their membership in our order. We did have Three men that Withdrew from the council and two that have transferred to other councils.

We completed this year's billing cycle at 98% of membership paid. Current

membership numbers at this writing stand at 380 + 32 Inactive members (Inactive members are members that have been suspended or removed from the council but need to stay on the Roster due to them having KofC insurance) for a total of 412. We had a gain of Seventeen men, (both new and transfers in). Six brothers that passed. May they all rest in peace. Since last year's Compass, of these 412,

28 are Honorary members, (at least 65 years old and twenty-five continuous years of service, up six from last year) 87 are Honorary Life members, (at least 70 years old and 25 continuous years of service up 4 from last year) and 82 are 4th degree members. Remember too, that if you are a 4 th degree member and are suspended from the council you are also suspended from the 4 th degree regardless of if your dues are paid in the 4th degree. In addition, we still have 10 Brothers that are nonagenarian's (men that are 90 – 99 years of age, and One turning 102 in July) May God bless them and give them long life!! Lastly of the 380 men, 353 are in NJ, 2 in Co, 3 in Del, 11 in Florida, 2 in Georgia, 1 in Illinois, 1 in NY, 2 in Pa, 1 in South Carolina 1 in Tennessee, 2 in Texas, and finally 1 in Virginia. You can see that our brothers are scattered around the country in 12 different states. Looks like a bunch are down in Sunny Florida! Revenue for this Columbian year, from June of 2024 - Dec of 2024 = \$34,136.00 (Because of Rain, we LOST an approximate revenue of \$10,000.00 from the car show.) From Jan 2024 through almost the End of June (remember this is being written mid-June) we have Revenue of \$20,046.31 for a Grand total of \$57,182.31. I am looking for some nice numbers on the Baby Bottle Boomerang Fund raiser which is not complete as of this writing. I guess the missina information I have with the wrong phone numbers will stay that way! I still get NO replies from any request that I send out. Should you decide to send me your information. # **FIRST MILLENNIAL SAINT-CARLOS ACUTIS**

Acutis, an Italian teenager who died from leukemia in 2006, will be declared a saint by Leo at a ceremony in St. Peter's Square expected to be attended by thousands of young people. Acutis was just 15 when he died, but during his short life he used his computing skills to spread awareness of the Catholic faith by setting up a website that documented reports of miracles.
